Notes from the Musical Director



Firstly, a big thank you to everyone who contributed to our performance at the National Brass Band Championships of Great Britain, including those who supported our fundraising effort, our fun committee and to our supporters on the day, especially our former players Hazel and Alice who made the journey from Cambridge.

A special mention must be made of Lisa, who broke her holiday in the Scillies to return and play for us before catching the next ferry back. I was delighted with our fourth place (could you tell?): any top six placing at a national final is always a good result when you are up against the top two

or three bands from every region within the UK. More importantly, we played the same band as we did at the area, throughout the spring and summer and will be playing through our autumn and Christmas seasons: sadly, some of our competitors are already advertising for players. Welcome back to Andrew, Ian, and Henry, who stood down from rehearsals from the nationals when we had to reduce to just 25 brass players. Thank you for your understanding, and it is good to get back to having all our players at rehearsal again.

Following our national finals success, we had just one week before our concert for the Red Cross, and, despite the lack of rehearsals on the concert programme, we gave an excellent performance. Well done to our soloists James (Yeti), Emma and James (Diva) and thank you to our deps Karen, Jo, and Chris. We now have some busy few months ahead of us: we have a lot of concerts (and hence new pieces to practice), we have the NEMBBA contest in November and we need another good area result to secure promotion to the second section.

Our training band too is playing well and we now have approaching forty players at rehearsals. We have our first concert for some time on 27th October at Breaston church, which we are all looking forward to, and which will of course include our programme for the NEMBBA contest.

Adjudicator's Comments: Christopher Bond

I) On Imber Down

The opening takes a little time to settle and snare drum dominates a little too much. It's tight and tidy though through to 11. 15 – well done, cornet. The music has character but I could definitely have more through 31. 39 works well with good percussive effects. 49 is stylish. 57 well done flug/horn. Not tidy into 62. 66 is effective but feels a little heavy (it still needs energy despite the tenutos in timp, basses and troms). Tidy to close.

II) The Church of St. Giles

You capture good atmosphere to open. Effects are all secure although cohesion of dynamic effects could sometime be more together (e.g. horns bar 5). 10 – Well done euph and flugel. 22 - Cornet plays well. Could it have a little more warmth? Well done, horn. 29 good sounds. 35 – it has control. A little more warmth and shaping would enhance this further. Good horns at 43. 50/51 is well managed and not overdone. 56 good glock. Euph plays well. An occasional blemish around the band doesn't detract. 66 not together. Excellent to close. Great tam-tam.

III) Imemerie Aeternum

Basses good to open. Troms listen carefully – not always in tune. You capture the atmosphere well. **23** Super sop. The accel is a little abrupt at **31.35** - percussion too loud (but it is very exciting – I'll give you that!). **41** good overall. **63** – needs more style (and volume) from euphs and baritone. **75** – it's triumphant but doesn't always flow. It can feel a little static at times. **130** needs to dance along more successfully (more character, cornets, etc.). A confident close and final two bars.

Overall a performance with lots to admire. Much of your performance was controlled and the second movement especially had impressive moments. Consider how to further improve the overall cohesion of the band, always playing close attention to balance, blend and style.

- I) Start OK. 11 good euph 15 well done solo cornet 23 good percussion and all soloists play well. 31 good euph & baritones. 39 good metre 48 I don't hear semi-quavers 49 good band sound 57 good horns 62 good band sound and at 66. 78 good balance 83 -> end Nice ending
- II) 1-10 everything fits well, with good effects. 12 good euphonium 17 well done flugel 22 solo cornet starts well, just a little under the note. 29->34 lovely sounds 35 let the music flow 50/1 well done 56 good trombs and glock 64-67 just a little wobbly on the baritones and euph, but a good close.
- III) Good start. 13 nice playing cornets 23 good sop and the music builds well 35 percussion a touch heavy 41 played with drive well done 56 good Eb bass 63 good 75 I can hear all the notes well done 91 good band sound 103 good forte dynamic 109-end some very good moments dynamic contrast just missing in parts Thank you.

Adjudicator's Comments: Stanley Lippeatt

- I) Fair start made and clarity noted. 11-> Soloists confident. Balance working well. 31 Neat and tidy Good build to 49. 53-66 Good clean playing. 67 Bass dominated!!! 78 well controlled dynamics. Good ending.
- **II)** Bar **2** not together to start. Troms play well Bar **12** Euph plays well as does flugel. **22** Cornet & Horn blends well. **29-35** well controlled **35** Euph could be warmer and play with more feeling, but yes this is good playing. **50-51** Good effort **58** Again bravo euph. Good ending.
- **III)** Troms could be stronger in their controlled dynamic (balance). **23** Good sop. Good build to **35. 35** Perc O.T.T. **41** Good clean playing **63** Good style **75** Fine band sounds **105** Church theme could be more evident, fine drama to end.

A fine performance. Well done Band, Soloist & MD. Just in the last movement the perc. At times was O.T.T.


